GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Thunder defeated the Timberwolves in wire-to-wire fashion as Oklahoma City set a season-high by recording 29 assists on a season-high (tying) 44 made field goals.
- For the first time this season, seven Thunder players finished scoring in double-figures. OKC is 17-3 when Nenad Krstic scores 10+ points.
- OKC shot 54.3% (44-81 FGs) from the field while limiting MIN to 40.7% shooting. Thunder is a perfect 12-0 this season when shooting 50.0% or better.
- The Thunder led by as many as 25 points in the second half. On the night, the OKC starters outscored the MIN starters by a 76-47 margin.
- Thunder rookie Serge Ibaka came off the bench to tally a season-high 14 points on 7-of-9 shooting in just 19 minutes of action.
- OKC outrebounded MIN 47-43 and outscored the Timberwolves 62-40 in the paint.
- Russell Westbrook matched a career-high by handing-out 15 assists to go along with 18 points (7-11 FGs) for his 15th double-double of the season. In the two meetings this past week versus MIN (2/26 & 2/21), Westbrook recorded 29 total assists.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- In a game that featured 18 lead changes and 13 ties, Manu Ginobili recorded 10 of his game-high 26 points in the fourth quarter as the Spurs ended the Thunder's five-game road winning streak.
- After trailing by as many as nine points early in the second half, OKC pulled ahead 85-83 at the 4:31 mark of the fourth quarter thanks to a Russell Westbrook 18-foot jump shot. OKC would then miss their final eight shot attempts while the Spurs closed the game on a 12-2 run to secure the victory.
- Kevin Durant recorded a team-high 21 points and 12 rebounds for his 18th double-double of the season. Durant failed to reach the 25-point scored plateau for the first time since December 19th at Houston after becoming the only active NBA player to record 25+ points in 29 consecutive games.
- Tim Duncan helped lead the Spurs with 19 points and a game-high 15 rebounds. On the night, SA outscored OKC 48-28 in the paint.
- Oklahoma City played without Nick Collision (right knee) and Serge Ibaka (lower back).

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After trailing 58-73 at the 6:40 mark of the third quarter, Oklahoma City Outscored Phoenix 40-15 during the next 13 minutes before taking a 98-88 advantage thanks to a Kevin Durant 12-foot jump shot with 5:03 left in regulation. From that point forward, OKC would not convert another field goal as PHX closed the game on a 14-4 run to snap the Thunder's nine-game win-streak.
- With the game tied at 102 apiece, Jason Richardson hit the game-winning 10-foot floating jump shot in the lane with 0.7 seconds remaining. On the ensuing OKC possession, Jeff Green's failed to connect on a baseline three-point jump shot as time expired.
- Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 36 points on 13-of-24 shooting for his 33rd 30+ point scoring effort of the season (22-11 OKC record). Durant's 29.9 point per game scoring average now leads the NBA. No OKC franchise player has ever led the NBA in scoring at season's end.
- The Suns outrebounded the Thunder by a 45-35 margin. On the season, OKC is winless when (0-5) outrebounded by 10 or more.
- Through three quarters, Phoenix guard Grant Hill converted 8-of-9 field goal attempts en route to 18 of his 21 points.
- Russell Westbrook made half of his 18 shots and finished with a team-high 10 assists for his third straight double-double (includes triple-double at MIN on 2/21). The three consecutive double-doubles is a career-best for Westbrook.

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

All Good Things Must Come to an End: With their loss to the Phoenix Suns on Tuesday (2/23) night, the Thunder fell victim to a loss for the first time in nearly a month (1/27 vs. Chicago). The Thunder loss snapped a run of nine straight Oklahoma City victories. The nine consecutive wins is the longest streak for the OKC franchise since the team won nine games in a row after losing its season opener to begin the 2004-05 season (11/5/04 – 11/19/04). Additionally, the nine-game streak at the time was the longest win streak in the NBA. During the nine game undefeated stretch, the Thunder shot 47.5% from the floor while outscoring the opposition by a 104.9 to 96.6 margin.

A Run for the Record-Books: In a streak that spanned 64 days, Kevin Durant became the ONLY active NBA player to score 25 or more points in 29 consecutive games. The streak which began 12/22 at LAL came to an end on Wednesday night (2/24) when Durant recorded a team-high 21 points in the Thunder's loss to San Antonio. During the 29-game run, the Thunder posted a record of 20-9 as KD averaged 32.4 points on 50.8% shooting including 50.0% (51-102) from behind the three-point arc. Durant

becomes the first player in NBA history under the age of 22 to piece-together 29 straight games of 25+ points. Ray Allen held the previous franchise mark by recording 25-plus in ten straight games during the 2006-07 season. Michael Jordan was the last player to exceed KD's streak when he recorded 25+ points in 40 straight games during the 1986-87 season.

NBA's Leading Scorer...Almost: In recent days Kevin Durant and LeBron James have each taken turns leading the NBA in scoring. After back-to-back 36-point performances by James in Cleveland's victories over Boston (2/25) and Toronto (2/26), KD (29.7 ppg) now finds himself trailing LeBron (30.0) ever so slightly in the race for the league's scoring title. If KD were to lead the league in scoring at season's end, he would become the first ever OKC franchise player to accomplish the feat. Dating back to Christmas day, Durant leads the NBA with a 31.6 point-per-game average on 49.7% field goal shooting including 46.7% (49-105) three-point shooting. During OKC's recent game versus Portland (2/9) KD reached the 1,500 point scored mark on the season and in doing so becomes the second youngest player in NBA history to score 1,500 points through the first 51 games of the season (LeBron James 49 games; 2/10/06).

30 Never Looked so Good: With his 36 points versus the Phoenix Suns (2/23), Durant registered his 33rd 30-plus scoring game of the season. The 33 games of 30+ points are the MOST in the NBA this year. Most importantly, the Thunder is 22-11 when Durant scores 30+. Durant is just two 30-point efforts away from tying the franchise-record for most 30-point games in a season (Spencer Haywood; 1972-1973). Earlier this year, Durant set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests (12/22 – 1/2). During this two-week long run, Durant posted averages of 33.6 points on 56.8% shooting (84-148 FG's) including 45.8% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (11-24). LeBron James was the last NBA player to piece together a seven-game string of 30+ points scored (November 2007).

Westbrook Dealing: After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook tallied his 18th double-figure assist game of this season Friday, February 26th versus Minnesota as he matched a career-high with 15 assists to go along with 18 points for his 15th double-double of the season. Earlier this month (2/20 – 2/23), Westbrook posted three straight double-doubles (career-best). Westbrook, who currently ranks T-7th in the NBA with 7.8 assists per game, recorded double-figure assist totals in four straight contests (12/28 – 1/2). The last OKC franchise player to record such a feat was Gary Payton who handed-out 10-plus assists in four consecutive games during the 2001-02 season (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Oklahoma City is 13-4 this year when Westbrook records 10+ assists.

Winning with D: With their 109-92 victory over Minnesota on Friday night, the Thunder now ranks 7th in the NBA by allowing 95.8 points per game (allowed 103.1 points per game last season). The Thunder has held their opponent to 90 points or fewer in seventeen games this season (15-2 record in such contests). Oklahoma City leads the NBA in opponent field goal percentage as the Thunder allow their opposition to shoot 43.7%. Lastly, defense is quickly becoming the trademark during Thunder victories this season. In the 34 Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC, SA, MIA, WAS, UTA, MIL, PHI, GS, MEM, DET, PHX, CHA, NJ, WAS, UTA, CHI, IND, NY, MIA, ATL, MIN, DEN, GS, ATL, NO, GS, POR, DAL, NY and MIN), OKC is allowing only 93.1 points per game on 42.5% shooting.

Boards are the Barometer: With the NBA schedule roughly two-thirds complete, rebounding has proven to be a key element of the Thunder's early-season success. OKC who ranks 3rd in the NBA in rebounding, has outrebounded their opponent in 37 of 57 games this season. In those games, OKC posts a 27-10 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder is just 7-13 when they fail to outrebound their opponent. During a three-game stretch to close-out 2009 (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three straight contests. It had been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder is 10-1 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

Back-2-Back Sets: With their match-ups versus the Suns (2/23) and Spurs (2/24), the Thunder has now closed-out 12 of their 18 back-to-backs this season. By "sweeping" their back-to-back versus the Knicks (2/20) and Timberwolves (2/21), OKC has now "swept" three back-to-backs this season. Earlier this year, the Thunder captured a "sweep" of a back-to-back match-up by defeating the Nets and Wizards on 12/28 and 12/29. It was the first "sweep" of a B-2-B by the OKC franchise since March 27th and 28th of 2007. During the teams' 12 already completed back-to-backs this season, the Thunder secured a "split" in six of those match-ups to go along with three "sweeps". This year, the Thunder is 6-6 on the first night of a back-to-back and 6-6 on the second night. Last season, the Thunder posted an 8-28 record in their back-to-back match-ups (3-15 in first game, 5-13 in second game).

Road Warriors: With their victory over the Minnesota Timberwolves (2/21), the Thunder won five consecutive roads games for the first time since February of 2005. Earlier this season, the Thunder pieced together two separate three-game road winning streaks. As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three straight road contests in each of the last two seasons. Despite their loss to the Spurs at the Target Center (2/24), OKC owns a 17-12 record away from the Ford Center. The 17 road wins exceeds the combined road win total for the past two seasons (15). The Thunder is one of only SEVEN NBA teams to boast a winning road record this season.

Feasting on the East: With their victory over the New York Knicks (2/20), OKC is 17-6 (.739) versus Eastern Conference opponents. The 17 wins against "The East" are more than twice the Thunder road win total for all of last season. This year, OKC has already "swept" FIVE Eastern Conference teams (Miami, Detroit, Washington, Atlanta and New York). Last season, the Thunder failed to "sweep" a single Eastern Conference foe as OKC concluded the year with an 8-22 mark against "The East".

All-Star Recap: Kevin Durant made his inaugural NBA All-Star debut last Saturday night (2/14) at Cowboy Stadium in front of a record crowd of 108,713 on hand to witness a 141-139 Eastern Conference victory. Durant came off the "West" bench to see 20 minutes of action during which time he knocked-down half of his 14 shots en route to 15 points and five rebounds. On Saturday night (2/13), Durant captured his second H-O-R-S-E victory as he eliminated Boston's Rajon Rondo and Sacramento's Omri Casspi. Meanwhile, Thunder rookie James Harden and second-year guard Russell Westbrook competed in the T-Mobile Rookie-Sophomore Challenge and Youth Jam held at the American Airlines Center on Friday night (2/12). Westbrook led all scorers with 40 points on 18-29 shooting in 32 minutes of action. James Harden helped lead the rookies to victory as he posted 22 points (9-14 FGs) in just 23 minutes of action. Westbrook was also added as a last-minute replacement for Derrick Rose in the NBA Skills Competition.

Youth Movement: As of February 24, the Oklahoma City Thunder is the youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 24 years and 338 days (Memphis 2nd youngest; 24 years, 364 days). Additionally, as of opening night (10/28), the OKC starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days (as of opening night). There are currently nine players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

Select Company: If Kevin Durant were to maintain his current 29-plus scoring clip throughout the remainder of the season, he would find himself amongst some select NBA company. Only LeBron James has posted a higher scoring total than Durant at age 21 or younger. To the right is a list of other notable scoring totals for players age 21 or younger.

45-4-KD: In the Thunder's recent outing versus Golden State (1/31), Kevin Durant posted his 14th double-double of the year by recording a season-high 45 points to go along with 11 rebounds. By converting 16-of-21 field goals, KD becomes just the second player in franchise history to record 45+ points on better than 75.0% shooting (Spencer Haywood on 1/7/72; 48 pts on 21-28 FGs). Shaquille O'Neal was the last NBA player to accomplish such a feat {2/27/09 TOR @ PHX (48 pts on 21-28 FGs)}.

Filling up the Ford: The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11th best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%. This season, the Thunder has sold-out sixteen of their 28 home contests. The Thunder is drawing an average crowd of 17,916 representing 98.4% capacity.

Talking Turnovers: During OKC's game at Milwaukee (1/2), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook handed-out 13 assists without committing a single turnover. With ZERO turnovers against the Bucks, he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). Additionally, it is the most assists without a turnover in the NBA in nearly a year (Chris Paul 15 assists, zero turnovers; 1/6/09). With his zero-turnover performance in the Thunder's recent win vs. NY (1/11), Westbrook has failed to commit a single turnover in five games this season (4-1 OKC record). As a team, the Oklahoma City Thunder committed 14 or fewer turnovers in EIGHT consecutive games to close 2009 (12/16 – 12/29). On the year, OKC is 18-10 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.

Close, but... The Oklahoma City Thunder lost four games played between 1/13 – 1/23 (CLE, MEM, DAL and SA) by a combined FIVE points. The aggregate five point deficit is the smallest combined margin of defeat for four consecutive losses in franchise history. It has been more than a decade since another NBA team last experienced four straight losses by a total of just five points (Indiana Pacers; 3/30/99 – 4/10/99).

Another Thunder POW: Russell Westbrook earned his first Player of the Week award for 2009-10 it was announced earlier this month by the NBA. Westbrook won the award for games played February 1-7. During the seven day span Westbrook helped lead Oklahoma City to a 3-0 week, including two wins on the road (GS, NO) while averaging 19.7 points, 9.7 assists, 8.0 rebounds and 3.3 steals. Earlier this season, Thunder forward Kevin Durant was twice named NBA Player of the Week (January 25-31 and December 28 through January 3).

New and Improved: Through the first four-plus months of the NBA season, Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook has shown an improved all-around game. During his first 57 contests, Westbrook is averaging 16.5 points, 7.7 assists and 5.2 rebounds in 35.4 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

Technically Speaking: With eight (individual) technical fouls called through the first 57 games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

Defending When it Matters: During the Thunder's 83-79 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers (11/11) at STAPLES Center, OKC held the Clippers to just 10 4th quarter points on 15.8% shooting (3-19 FG's). The 10 points surrendered in the 4th quarter is the fewest allowed since the 2006-07 season when the OKC franchise held the New Orleans Hornets to an all-time franchise low six 4th quarter points. Through the first 57 games of the season, the Thunder is limiting their opponents to 22.5 points during the final 12 minutes of regulation.

KD in Rarified Air: With his 28-point performance on 11-of-22 shooting versus the Jazz in Utah, Kevin Durant became just the fourth player in league history, joining LeBron James (twice), Shaquille O'Neal and Michael Jordan, to score at least 400 points during the first 15 games of a season at age 21 or younger. Red-hot scoring streaks are not unfamiliar territory to Durant. Last season prior to his injury at Dallas (2/27), Kevin Durant found himself on a scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). It had been 35 years since a second-year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

Perfection from the Stripe: During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

Harden's Greatest Hits: In the Thunder match-ups vs. Orlando (11/18) and Washington (11/20), Harden connected on 10-of-13 3-point field goals including seven consecutive makes during this two-game stretch. The seven consecutive makes ties a rookie record for the most consecutive 3-pointers converted by a first-year player since Michael Dickerson made eight straight for the Houston Rockets (5/4/99-5/5/99). His six 3-point makes at Orlando (11/18) tied a rookie franchise record (Rich Frahm; 12/20/03).

Century Mark: On December 2nd versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100th career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14th time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.

Strong back-2-back Showings at the Ford: With their 127-108 victory over the Wizards on 11/20 and their 108-90 win over the Milwaukee Bucks on 11/27, the OKC franchise won back-to-back home games by 18-plus points for the first time since November of 2004 (Nov. 5th – 10th). During this two-game home tear, the Thunder averaged 117.5 points on 50.3% shooting (48.6% 3-point shooting). The 127 points scored versus the Wizards on 11/20 was the most recorded in regulation (excluding overtime) by the OKC franchise since February 21st, 2001 (127-98 win vs. DEN).
